Dickinson College Satisfactory Acade Progres (SAP) Police

Dickinson College offers both federal and institutional financial aid. Eligibility for federal and institutional need-based financial aid istetermined through the submission of the required documents (FAFSA, CSS Profile, federal tax returns chedules, and W2's) by the College's listed deadline dates. In addition to this, students must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) to continue receiving Title IV federal financialaid. Dickinson College follows the established Federal guidelines to determine SAP.

FEDERATINANCIAL AID

The Financial Aid Office has established the following policies and proceeding the requirements in the Higher Education Act (HEA). All Dickinson College students receiving Title IV federal financial aid meet the criteria below regardless of whether previously received federal financial aid.

Satisfactory Academic Progresse standards must meet the following criteria:

- x The policy is at least as strict as the policy the institution applies to a student who is not receiving assistance under theit IV, HEA programs.
- x Provides consistent application of standards to all students within categories of students (full-part-time, undergraduate, graduate, and education programs established by the institution).
- x Academic progress must be evaluated annually, at minimum.
- x Include both quantitative (pace) and qualitative (grade) elements.
- x Provide specific procedures under which a student may appeal a determination that the student is not making satisfactory progress including documentation that the student is
